1) Answer: a)

Local Area Banks have jurisdiction over a maximum of three contiguous districts, and their basic function is to mobilise funds in rural and semi-urban areas. There are only four Local Area Banks (LAB) in India

Coastal Local Area Bank Ltd (Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh)

Capital Local Area Bank Ltd (Phagwara, Punjab)

Krishna Bhima Samruddhi Local Area Bank Ltd (Mahbubnagar, Telangana)

Subhadra Local Area Bank Ltd., Kolhapur (Kolhapur, Maharashtra)

2) Answer: c)

The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) introduced to banks, financial institutions, Corporates and Government/s a service termed as National Automated Clearing House (NACH).

The "Retail Loans" given by commercial banks are generally for a duration of less than 5-7 years only. The amount of Loan under retail lending normally range between Rs. 20000 to Rs. 1 crore.

The Reserve bank of India has the authority to issue currency. The current system of Indian government to issue notes is "Minimum Reserve System". Under this policy, the minimum reserves to be maintained in the form of gold and foreign exchange should consists of rupees 200 crore. Out this reserve, the value of gold to be maintained is rupees 115 crore. This system was introduced in 1956 replacing the proportional reserve system, and continues till date.
