



1) Answer: B

Gross National Product (GNP) is an estimate of total value of all the final products and services turned out in a given period by the means of production owned by a country's residents. GNP measures goods and services produced by any entity (such as citizens or companies) belonging to a country, regardless of where the production of that good or service actually takes place whereas GDP measures production within the Geographical boundary.

2) Answer: D

LIBOR is a benchmark rate that some of the world's leading banks charge each other for short-term loans. It stands for London Interbank Offered Rate (LIBOR). The LIBOR serves seven different maturities: overnight, one week, and 1, 2, 3, 6 and 12 months.

3) Answer: E

The commemorative coins are often issued by the RBI in order to recognize any memorable events in the country. However, such coins are not legal tenders in circulation.

The first ever commemorative coin was issued in 1964 in order to mourn the death of the first ever Prime Minister of India, Jawaharlal Nehru. Narendra Modi recently introduced a commemorative coin of Rs 350 to mark the birth anniversary of Guru Gobind Singh

4) Answer: D

A Certificate of Deposit is a money market instrument that is issued by banks and select financial organizations to raise short-term capital from the market. Scheduled Commercial Banks, All-India Financial Institutions permitted by RBI can issue CDs to raise capital. Regional Rural Banks and Local Area Banks are not allowed to issue CDs. The maximum period of maturity of CD is not more than a year.

5) Answer: B

In the bancassurance model, banks distribute insurance products as an agent of the insurance company. This is defined under Section 6(1) of the Banking Regulation Act 1949. It first came into being in Europe in the 1980s and it was successful there, only to be replicated all over the world.

6) Answer: E

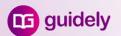
Satyadev Narayan Arya is the current governor of Haryana. He belongs to Bhartiya Janta Party.

India's tallest statue, the statue of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel is located in the state of Gujarat, India. Statue of Unity has a height of 182 metres (597 ft) and is the world's tallest statue. It is located on the Sardar Sarovar Dam on river Narmada in Kevadiya colony, 100 kilometres (62 mi) southeast of the city of Vadodara.

The North Koel Dam is in the core of the Palamau Tiger Reserve. The Palamau Tiger Reserve is one of the nine original tiger reserves in India spread over an area of 1,129.93 sq kms and spans across both Palamu and Latehar districts. The tiger reserve forms the part of Betla National Park and Palamu Wildlife Sanctuary.
