Muslim Women Rights Day - Observed on Aug 01

Muslim Women Rights Day is observed on August 1.

Additional Info:

- This year marks the **second anniversary** of the passage of the **triple talaq bill** in Parliament which is officially known as the **Muslim Women Act (Protection of Rights on Marriage) passed in the Rajya Sabha.**
- The law made the 'triple talaq' a criminal offence.

World Breastfeeding Week 2021: 01 – 07 August

- World Breastfeeding Week is an annual celebration which is held every year from 1 to 7 August in more than 120 countries.
- the theme for breastfeeding week 2021: "Protect Breastfeeding: A Shared Responsibility".

Additional Info:

- The World Health Organization states, breastfeeding is one of the most effective ways to ensure child health and survival.
- World Breastfeeding Week is celebrated to encourage women to breastfeed for the all-around development of a child.

Hiroshima Day - Observed on Aug 06

- August 6, observed solemnly as Hiroshima Day around the world, will be the 76th anniversary of the atomic bombing of the Japanese city in the final year of World War II.
- On this day in **1945**, the United States dropped the very first deployed nuclear bomb in the city of Hiroshima, wiping out an **estimated 39 per cent of the population, most of whom were civilians**.

Additional Info:

- Along with the atomic bombing of Nagasaki three days later, these instances remain the only recorded use of nuclear weapons in armed conflict.
- Hiroshima bombings of 1945 were "necessitated", by the United States, as the Allied Forces
 continued to struggle against Japan even after Germany's surrender in World War II.

TRIFED to celebrate its 34th Foundation Day

- On Aug 06, 2021, Tribal Cooperative Marketing Federation of India (TRIFED) celebrated its 34th foundation day.

Nation observes 79th anniversary of Quit India movement on 8 August

- The Quit India Movement was started by Mahatma Gandhi on August 8, 1942, during the Second World War, demanding an end to British rule in India.
- The **Movement was accompanied by** a mass protest on non-violent lines by which Mahatma Gandhi called for "an orderly British withdrawal; from India."

International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples - Observed on Aug 09

• The International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples is observed on 9 August each year to raise awareness and protect the rights of the world's indigenous population.

• Theme 2021: "Leaving no one behind: Indigenous peoples and the call for a new social contract."

Additional Info:

- This event also recognizes the achievements and contributions that indigenous people make to improve world issues such as environmental protection.
- It was first pronounced by the General Assembly of the United Nations in December 1994, marking the day of the first meeting of the UN Working Group on Indigenous Populations of the Sub commission on the Promotion and Protection of Human Rights, in 1982.

Nagasaki Day Observed on August 9

- Nagasaki Day is observed on 9 August.
- In 2021, the world is observing the 76th anniversary of the Nagasaki bombing.

Aim:

- To promote peace politics and raise awareness of the effects of the bomb attack on Nagasaki.
- This day plays an important role as it focuses on anti-war and anti-nuclear demonstrations in many countries.
- The bomb that was dropped on Nagasaki was code-named the 'Fat Man', due to the design of the bomb as it had a wide, round shape.
- It is the second city after Hiroshima to be attacked by a nuclear bomb.
- An area of about 5 square miles was completely obliterated and around 65,000 people were killed in the bombing.

World Lion Day Observed On Aug 10, 2021

Globally every year on August 10 World Lion Day is observed.

Additional Info:

- To raise awareness about lions and to mobilise support for their protection and conservation.
- It was established by 'Big Cat Rescue' world's largest accredited sanctuary for big cats.
- World Lion Day was launched in 2013.
- As per the International Union for Conservation of Nature's (IUCN)'s Red List of Threatened Species (2016), the Panthera leo has two subspecies: Panthera Leo and Panthera leo persica, found in Africa and Asia.

Note:

- Lions are currently listed as "vulnerable" on the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List of Threatened Species.
- In West Africa, the species is now classified as "critically endangered."

About Biofuel:

- Any fuel that is derived from biomass (plant, or algae material, or animal waste) is known as biofuel.
- They are renewable, biodegradable, and sustainable sources of energy.
- Biofuels are known to contain no sulfur and produce low carbon monoxide and toxic emissions, as compared to conventional fossil fuels.

International Youth Day - observed on Aug 12

- Every year, International Youth Day is observed on August 12.
- This year's theme is "Transforming Food Systems: Youth Innovation for Human and Planetary Health".

Additional Info:

- On this day, governments and citizens across the world come together to recognize and bring attention to the **problems faced by the youth**.
- In 1999, the United Nations decided to commemorate International Youth Day every year on August 12.
- It was based on a recommendation made by the **World Conference of Ministers Responsible for Youth** in **Lisbon** to the UN General Assembly.

World Elephant Day - observed on Aug 12

Additional Info:

- This day is marked by **raising awareness about the difficulty of the elephants** in the forests and also finding out possible ways to protect them.
- The main aim of World Elephant Day is to make people **aware of better treatment of captive elephants** and against their illegal poaching and trade for ivory.
- World Elephant Day was launched to highlight the difficulty of Asian and African elephants, which
 face many threats like poaching, habitat loss, and conflict with humans and being mistreated in
 captivity.

World Organ Donation Day - Observed on Aug 13

- August 13 of every year is observed as World Organ Donation Day aimed at raising awareness about the importance of organ donation and encourages people to take a pledge for the same.
- One person can save up to **eight** lives from chronic illness by pledging to donate their **heart**, kidney, pancreas, lungs, liver, intestines, hands, face, tissues, bone marrow, and stem cells.

Additional Info:

- The first-ever organ donation was done in 1954 when Ronald Lee Herrick donated a kidney to his identical twin brother.
- Doctor Joseph Murray conducted the procedure for which he has also won the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in 1990 for advances in organ transplantation.

Organ donation in India:

- India has the Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act to regulate organ donation in the country.
- The law allows both deceased and living people to donate their organs.
- According to a World Health Organization, around 0.01 per cent of people in India donate their organs after death.

International Lefthanders Day - Observed on Aug 13

- International Left Handers Day is an international day observed annually on August 13 to celebrate the uniqueness and differences of left-handed individuals.
- The day was first observed in 1976 Campbell, founder of Lefthanders International, Inc.

International Lefthanders Day was created to celebrate sinistrality and raise awareness of the advantages and disadvantages of being left-handed in a predominantly right-handed world.

It celebrates left-handed people's uniqueness and differences, a subset of humanity comprising seven to ten percent of the world's population.

PM Modi announces August 14 to be observed as 'Partition Horrors Remembrance Day'

- In Red Fort on A day before India's Independence Day, Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared that **August 14** will be observed as **Partition Horrors Remembrance Day**.
- Displacement of millions, killing and rapes during the partition are still vivid and observing this day is recognition of their sacrifices.
- Pakistan celebrates August 14 as its Independence Day.

75th Indian Independence Day 2021

- India is celebrating 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav', marking the completion of a quarter to a century of freedom from British colonial rule.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi unfurled the national flag at the Red Fort in New Delhi and addressed the nation.
- It was followed by a series of events organized by the armed forces and security personnel saluting the tricolour with a guard of honour.

World Humanitarian Day - Observed on Aug 19

- World Humanitarian Day is observed every year on 19 August.
- The theme for World Humanitarian Day 2021: immediate human cost of the climate crisis.

Additional Info:

- The aim is to pressurize world leaders to take meaningful climate action for the world's most vulnerable people.
- The day is observed around the world to recognize the people who work for a humanitarian cause, and the people who lost their lives working for humanitarian causes.

World Photography Day - Observed on Aug 19

- August 19 of every year is celebrated as World Photography Day across the world, dedicated to the art, craft, science and history of photography.

 naturally doesn't have any side effect on environment, and by using this energy we can use the
 traditional energy for more long time.

Sadbhavana Diwas - Observed on Aug 20

- Sadbhavana Diwas (Harmony Day) is celebrated in India on 20th August every year.
- On this day, we celebrate the **birth anniversary of former PM Rajiv Gandhi of the country**.

- This year marks his 77th birthday.
- Rajiv Gandhi became India's youngest PM at the age of 40 from 1984 to 1989.
- The message of this day celebrated in the memory of Rajiv Gandhi is that people of all religions and beliefs should live together in the country.

- Major Dhyan Chand, widely known as the "Hockey Wizard" and "The Magician", was born on August 29, 1905.

Additional Info:

- This day marks the birthday of Major Dhyan Chand Singh, the hockey player who won **gold** medals in Olympics for India in the years 1928, 1932 and 1936.
- First National Sports Day was celebrated in India on 29 August 2012.

International Day against Nuclear Tests - Observed on Aug 29

 prevent nuclear catastrophes to avert devastating effects on humankind, the environment and the
 planet.

National Small Industry Day - Observed on Aug 30

- National Small Industry Day 2021 is on August 30.
- The day is celebrated to make the small scale business sector stronger and promote their well being.

- Small scale industries are those businesses that are sent out on a small scale and are usually run with the aid of local artisans and workers.
- Small Scale Industries is an industrial project with decided assets in **investment plants and tools**.

 August 2021.
- Through this Observance the United Nations aims to promote the extraordinary contributions of the African diaspora around the world and to eliminate all forms of discrimination against people of African descent.
- International days reflect the values that society shares.

Additional Info:

- All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights and have the potential to contribute constructively to the development and well-being of their societies.
- Any doctrine of racial superiority is scientifically false, morally condemnable, socially unjust, and
 dangerous and must be rejected, together with theories that attempt to determine the existence of
 separate human races.

Manipur's Patriot's Day 2021 - August 13
